GET READY TO FLY

The Clementsons have made space for robins to nest in a window sill of our home. The eggs have been laid, the robins are nesting and we are waiting for the arrival of hatchlings. I love this drama of life from building of the nest, the laying of eggs, the incubation, to the broken shells cast from the nest, the hungry little birds to that horrible moment when little fledglings leave the nest and scramble about seemingly helpless until they take flight. I remember last year when a little fledgling hid by our front door, its little head pushed into the corner of a wall cowering from the giant world that beckoned. I recall the next morning finding the little bird still hiding until I reached out to see if it was alive. To my surprise and perhaps the little bird too, it flew to a tree in my front yard clumsily clinging to a branch for a moment until it took wing and disappeared into the sky.

I believe that life is filled with stories that serve as wonderful parables for life in general and faith in particular. No doubt early May will see the drama of our growing Robin family. May is also a month of the Church year that will reflect upon the drama of the early Church. In the first weeks we will close out the season of Easter which will include the festivals of the Ascension of Our Lord and Pentecost. Throughout the season of Easter we heard the stories of frightened and confused disciples coming into the presence of the risen Jesus who offers them proof and peace to overcome their fearfulness. Then will come that moment when Jesus will leave them, ascending into heaven. The time arrived for (the one time students) to step out on their own and began the task of fulfilling the work of Jesus. As their Lord had revealed the love of God to them it would now be their turn to spread that same message. But with Jesus ascended it all felt overwhelming and no doubt they felt unfit.

I think of that little fledgling hiding at my door. How does one go from the comfort of a tiny nest to flying in the skies? How does one go from following Jesus around to going out into the world and telling others of God's love revealed in the crucified and risen Jesus? It was Pentecost, that amazing moment, the birth of the church when the Holy Spirit of God descended upon those uncertain followers giving them the courage, knowledge and strength to proclaim and live out the fullness of God's love.

The story of faith is not merely about knowing and loving Jesus. In the month of May we will hear God's word calling us to lives of faithful witness to the love of God. We will be reminded that the Holy Spirit who moved frighten disciples into bold Apostles is the same spirit that you and I have received in Baptism and in our walk of faith; The robin family in my window is reminding me that there comes that moment when we must leave our nest. As robins must do their thing in the world we too must do our thing as the children of God.

In a sudden rush a baby bird took wing. In the rush of the coming Spirit a Church was born and once fearful men and women boldly brought good news to all. Things haven't really changed for us, the Holy Spirit is among us and a sin darkened world awaits for us. May is a moment of new birth for all God's creation including we his children.

God bless you in this month as you take wing with the Holy Spirit lifting you. The world awaits you.

City Mission's Hope for Homeless Women

The City Mission's capital campaign, Hope for Homeless Women, is designed to raise \$6.4 million. This will enable the Mission to build a new building on its existing campus that will provide 50 additional beds for homeless women. Currently, the City Mission is forced to turn away 53-68 women per month due to lack of space.

ORLC has been offered a very generous matching grant of up to \$50,000 by an anonymous donor. This is exciting because of the potential it adds to the gifts from our congregational members. We will be introducing the campaign with an opportunity to give an immediate gift and/or to make a pledge that can be completed by the end of 2025. (In other words, this is a two-year campaign.)

The Hope for Homeless Women campaign at ORLC will begin on **Sunday, May 19** (Pentecost Sunday!) with guests from the City Mission who will give adult and youth presentations at 10am between the two worship services. Please pray about your participation in this opportunity that addresses a very important local need. Plan to be with us on Sunday, May 19 for worship and a special presentation at 10am between the worship services. That is the day that we will begin distributing the pledge information.

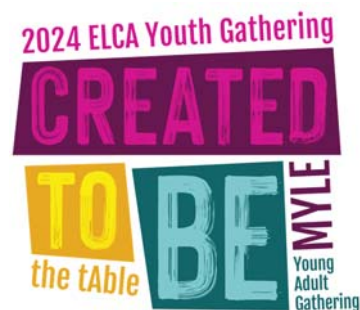
